NEW BUSINESS:

1. CONSENT AGENDA

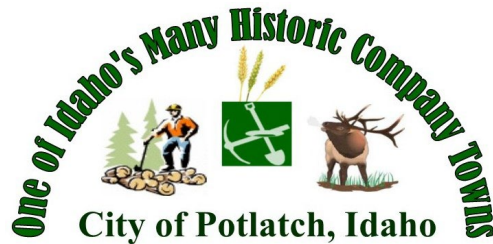

2. AMEND AGENDA TO ADD BROADBAND CABINET EASEMENT

Jennifer Anderson motioned to amend the agenda to add the broadband cabinet easement, Darrell Bostic seconded the motion. The motion was approved with all ayes.



3. CHARLIE LIDEAN – SLOW PITCH TOURNAMENT – POTLATCH DAYS

Charlie would like permission to use the ballfields in Scenic 6 Park during Potlatch Days for a slow pitch tournament. The tournament will raise money for the high school.

Jennifer Anderson motioned to approve the use of the ballfields during Potlatch Days, Marty Anderson seconded the motion. The motion was approved with all ayes.

4. CURT MCLAM – DE-ANNEXATION

Curt claims he has turned in proposals on the property located on HWY 6 east of town and he receives no answer. He (Elk River Enterprises) would like to withdraw from the city. Mayor Brown said they have not been done right by being told there was water when they annexed then told there was not water. City is working on drilling a new well. Curt says it will take too long for the city to get a well and there is no end to the delay. Until the City can give him a will-serve letter he cannot proceed. The Planning and Zoning Commission had a public hearing on 6/16/26 regarding the de-annexation request. Planning and Zoning was not comfortable making a decision until they had gathered more information from the city engineer. Curt is done waiting and requests council make a decision now. Mayor Brown reminded Council that they do have the final say over Planning and Zoning.

Mayor Brown read the resolution.

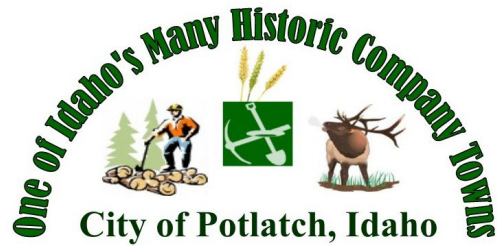

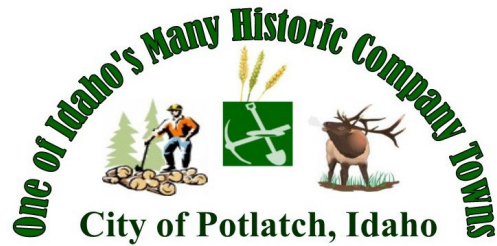

REPORTS:

1. **Parks – Jennifer Anderson**– No report
2. **Pool & Cemetery – Darrell Bostic** – Concrete at the pool has been fixed. Liner supplies have arrived, but no one was working there today. Mayor Brown said he would like to get a quote on fixing the decking.
Darrell said the propane tank for the new generator at the food pantry might need to go farther out behind the pantry into the garden area.



3. **Water & Sewer – Jody Long** – No report
4. **Streets – Marty Anderson** – Marty received a call from a resident that had a water leak over the weekend. They said there was no emergency number to call. Marty asked that Paul's work cell be listed on the website as the emergency after hours number.
5. **Mayor – David Brown** – Delfred Cone is selling his bucket truck. He wants \$5000.00 for it. Mayor said the carburetor was overhauled last summer and it runs well, he would like to make and offer. Marty said to offer \$4000.00
6. **Maintenance – Paul Kilborn** – Wood shavings needed for the playground. Mayor Brown said to order from Bennetts.
7. **Clerk-Treasurer – Harmony Nowack** – The Energy Audit has been completed on the City Hall and Community Center buildings. Final reporting on the audit findings needs to be completed by August 11th to receive \$1000.00 grant to make necessary energy conservation improvements on the buildings.

Public Comment: Tyler Foster asked if he could close the street from Maple and 7th to 8th St. for a few hours on the 4th of July for an early party. Council said that was fine and Paul could bring up some barrios on Thursday.
