Our Schools

As it neared the end of February, I began to wonder whether winter would arrive this year. Arrive it has, and just in time for the end of winter sports and the beginning of spring sports.

Potlatch Elementary held a STEAM Night for students and their families. Students and families worked together on creative projects that joined concepts from Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math (STEAM). Some of the projects included making parachutes to drop a cup and see it float; coding your name and making a bracelet; building the tallest straw-and-tape tower; creating LED light art; and many more fun activities. It was great to see families working together and smiling!



Thanks to all of you who joined in on the fun, and for those who made it happen!



The 100th day of school became “Glow Math” day for the 5th-grade students. Mrs. Carlson and Mrs. Weaver created glow-in-the-dark mathematical puzzles that stretched students’ computational and geometric skills. Math can be great fun!

The “Senior Project” has been in Idaho High Schools since the late ‘90s. In 2010, the State of Idaho made it a graduation requirement, effective for the class of 2013. The intent of the project was for seniors to research community issues or needs, career interests, or other academic interests. This try-before-you-buy research model was supposed to allow students to dip their toes in and see if the interest was truly something they wanted to pursue after high school. Senior Projects have three parts: the research paper, the project, and the presentation. I always enjoy sitting in on the presentations.

From sports camps and refereeing to welding and electrical work; illustrating plant life of the Palouse to graphic design and real estate; radio broadcasting to labor and delivery; astrophotography to auto mechanic; I was impressed with our students’ ability to present the information they learned through the research process and how their project related to that research. The topics were vast, interesting, and students were passionate about what they learned and demonstrated new skills. Idaho has renamed the Senior Project the Future Readiness Project and expects it to be rigorous in its writing and presentation

components.

Speaking of presentation skills, we have had a number of students participating. We have two CTE groups headed to state-level competitions in March. Ms. O’Shaughnessy will take BPA students to the Business Professionals of America competition, where students compete in assorted business, accounting, or marketing skills. Mrs. Bowles will take FCCLA students to the Family, Career, and Community Leaders of America competition, where students present on projects that focus on children, a chapter service project, and a public service project about ADHD awareness. I appreciate all the opportunities our students have to practice learning public communication and leadership skills.

The next Coffee with the Superintendent is scheduled for Wednesday, March 11 at 8 a.m. at Red Fir. Tricia Fiscus will join me. There is no pre-made agenda for this time. We want to discuss what you are interested in knowing more about. We look forward to seeing you there!


