## NEWS FROM THE GAMEBIRD FOUNDATION

Hi all, it is the time of the month that we get out a little news of what is happening with the Foundation. The Gamebird Foundation (TGBF) is a 501c3 non-profit corporation making all donations of funds and labor tax deductible. We are a very low budget corporation and we do appreciate any donations of help or money. Our members and friends are what helps the pheasant population grow.

We are right in the middle of getting ready for the new baby chick pheasant-raising season. For those that do not know, this time of the year our members and friends get the brooders set up and make sure the heat and water is ready for the baby chicks to start arriving. We get the day old baby chicks from Little Canyon Shooting Preserve. Idaho Fish and Game supply the baby chicks and TGBF raise them. The members supply the food and great habitat for the birds that we release into the wild habitat when they are about 9-10 weeks old.

By putting the pheasants out in a good habitat area, we can create a reservoir for the birds to reproduce. Where we have been doing this, we are seeing mama hens that we turned out the year before showing up with a new brood of chicks the following year. If you are interested in visiting one of the places, just give me a call and we can arrange for a visit.

We will be planning a field day in May at Joel Warner's place in Troy. We will announce the date at a later news release. Check out our Facebook page for updates. We will have the brooders loaded and ready for a visit. I had a visit with Joel last evening and he said he had a big beautiful rooster pheasant with about 15 or 16 hens in the field out behind the house. The hens will nest in the draw that runs up the hill for about a mile, and show up with babies in June and July.

Dale Rose is heading up a crew of (TGBF) members and their families building brooders for new members that are going to raise pheasant chicks this year. I am sure that they have built 25 new brooders this year. At this time, we have a few brooders left if anyone is interested in raising chicks. The brooders have a cost of about \$250.00 to complete them. We would like (if you can afford it) to deposit \$50.00 for the brooder, which we will return to you when you return the brooder or you can keep it to raise more baby pheasants. We do have plans if you would like to build your own.

We will have some great news on our youth hunting Access area and other Access areas around the Clearwater and the Panhandle regions in the near future. We may have some good news on a couple 30-40 acre habitat areas for pheasants and wildlife. You can become a part of this great group of folks by becoming a member for the family, just \$20.00 for a year membership. We meet once a month after this virus is over in Moscow at the Latah County Fairgrounds. Meetings open to the public.

## A PROCLAMATION

### For a Day of Humiliation, Fasting and Prayer.

WHEREAS, The Senate of the United States, devoutly recognizing the Supreme Authority and just Government of Almighty God, in all the affairs of men and of nations, has, by a resolution, requested the President to designate and set apart a day for National prayer and humiliation:

And Whereas, It is the duty of nations, as well as of men, to own their dependence upon the overruling power of God, to confess their sins and transgressions, in humble sorrow, yet with assured hope that genuine repentance will lead to mercy and pardon, and to recognize the sublime truth, announced in the Holy Scriptures and proven by all history, that those nations only are blessed whose God is the Lord:

And, Inasmuch as we know that, by His divine law, nations, like individuals, are subjected to punishments and chastisements in this world, may we not justly fear that the awful calamity of civil war, which now desolates the land, may be but a punishment inflicted upon us for our presumptuous sins, to the needful end of our national reformation as a whole People? We have been the recipients of the choicest bounties of Heaven. We have been preserved these many years in peace and prosperity. We have grown in numbers, wealth and power as no other nation has ever grown. But we have forgotten God. We have forgotten the gracious hand which preserved us in peace, and multiplied and enriched and strengthened us; and we have vainly imagined, in the deceitfulness of our hearts, that all these blessings were produced by some superior wisdom and virtue of our own. Intoxicated with unbroken success, we have become too self-sufficient to feel the necessity of redeeming and preserving grace, too proud to pray to the God that made us!

It behooves us, then, to humble ourselves before the offended Power, to confess our national sins, and to pray for clemency and forgiveness.

Now, therefore, in compliance with the request, and fully concurring in the views of the Senate, I do, by this my proclamation, designate and set apart THURSDAY, the 30th day of April, 1863, as a day of National Humiliation, Fasting and Prayer. And I do hereby request all the People to abstain on that day from their ordinary secular pursuits, and to unite, at their several places of public worship and their respective homes, in keeping the day holy to the Lord, and devoted to the humble discharge of the religious duties proper to that solemn occasion.

All this being done, in sincerity and truth, let us then rest humbly in the hope, authorized by the Divine teachings, that the united cry of the Nation will be heard on high, and answered with blessings, no less than the pardon of our national sins, and restoration of our now divided and suffering country to its former happy condition of unity and peace.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand, and caused the seal of the United States to be affixed.

Done at the city of Washington this thirtieth day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and of the Independence of the United States the eighty-seventh.

## OUR SCHOOLS—April/May 2020

This information I provided to Potlatch School District parents and guardians on Friday, April 17. I felt that this was appropriate to share with all community members and patrons so I am “recycling” my letter to make everyone aware of the latest concerns and the Idaho State Board of Education’s action plan.

Dear Parents & Guardians,

Although we are not in school at this time, it hasn’t slowed down the hectic pace we have had the past few weeks. News on the COVID-19 pandemic situation changes every hour in our state, as well as across the United States and the world. But seeing that we can only take care of our students and community, that’s where our focus lies. I’d like to personally thank those parents and community members, who have been so supportive of the school district and what we have been trying to accomplish while our students are away from our classrooms. Patience is truly a virtue but understanding and positive support really boosts our spirits as educators. We certainly hope that we are doing the same for you and our students because we are all in this together!

On Wednesday of this week, Governor Little extended his “Stay-At-Home” order for the state through the remainder of this month – going from April 20<sup>th</sup> to April 30<sup>th</sup>. He will readdress this again in the weeks to come. On Thursday, the State Board of Education provided criteria to school districts who are wanting to reopen their schools before the end of May. That criteria is as follows:

### Idaho State Board of Education Minimum Re-entry Criteria:

1. No statewide or local social distancing restrictions, including stay-home orders or extensive closures of businesses are in place.
  - a. Exceptions to the soft closure should continue to be considered for staff and student needs, on a case by case basis, as determined at the local level (e.g. small groups of students that can be distanced in a way that meets the social distancing criteria for the purpose of proctoring exams or working one-on-one with special education students, as long as the school district or charter school has sufficient capacity to maintain hygiene and sanitation).
2. The peak of the state infection curve has passed, as determined by the State Department of Health and Welfare, and a minimum of 14 days have passed from the identified peak. In those instances where local community spread has occurred, the local infection curve will be evaluated for determining the 14 consecutive days. School districts and charter schools located in counties that have experienced no community spread at the time state restrictions are lifted may have the 14 consecutive days criteria waived with approval by the local public health district.
3. Approval by the local public health district, after review of school district and charter school cleaning and disinfection protocols.
4. Re-entry plan approved by the local board of trustees identifying minimum school protocols (see list below).

#### Required Minimum School Protocols

- a. Cleaning and disinfection protocols.
- b. Identify and plan for vulnerable staff and students with a special emphasis on people over age 60 and those who are medically vulnerable.
- c. Identify and plan for staff duties which require close contact.
- d. Absenteeism plan for staff and students whose parents do not feel comfortable returning their student to school and for students who show symptoms of the coronavirus.
- e. Communications plan for informing parents and staff of the school district and charter school response plans, protocols, and policies to manage the impact of the coronavirus.
- f. Verify point of contact for each school district and charter school for effective communication and collaboration with the local public health officials.
- g. Reopening plans are reviewed in consultation with local public health officials.

As you can see, these will be difficult criteria pieces to meet, but there is an opportunity for reopening. The Board of Trustees and I will continue to discuss our options and look at future opportunities, as well as possible scenarios down the line.

We will get through this difficult time but we need to work together and support one another to make it happen. Please bear with us and, as always, thank you for your continued support of the Potlatch School District and if you have questions or comments, please contact me.

**Potlatch Alumni Scholarship**

In 1985, a fund was established to annually offer a scholarship to a graduate of Potlatch High School. Each year up to 30 Potlatch High graduates apply for this scholarship. There are four (4) criteria for eligibility for the scholarship:

- ◆ Be a graduate of Potlatch High School
- ◆ Have demonstrated scholastic or vocational ability
- ◆ Have financial need
- ◆ Have demonstrated potential to succeed

Applications are available each year from Potlatch High School. Only those making application for the scholarship on forms to be provided, shall be eligible, including prior recipients. Applications are available on the Potlatch School District website under the College and Career Center. Completed applications shall be turned into the principal or counselor by May 15.

We encourage alumni to contribute to the fund. All contributions apply only to the principal. The interest gained from donations is awarded annually as a scholarship; therefore, all donations will continue to provide scholarship money forever. An annual report is compiled each year to show additions to the fund, income gained and available, the funds awards and a progress report on the recipients.
