

2. RENEW CITY HALL OFFICE SPACE LEASES

Council reviewed leases and rent charges for City office rentals. After discussion Council decided not to raise rents for 2025.

4. COMMUNITY CENTER UTILITIES – LION'S CLUB SHARE?

Lion's Club is using the Community Center Building as a meeting place rent free, Mayor Brown thinks they should help pay for utilities. Darrell questioned how much they could afford and said if they are using the building for an event they should pay the rental fee. Marty thinks we should wait a year and see how much they actually use the building. Heat expense was high this last month. Jerry will make sure heat is turned down and locked.

No action taken at this time.


5. KME QUOTE – SEWER LIFT PUMP & REPAIRS

Council reviewed the bid for a new pump at the lift station. The bid did not seem to include fixing the electrical issue with the current pump #2. Council would like to see another bid. Mayor Brown will call Pumptech for a bid as advised by city engineer as Pumptech installed the current system.

Darrell Bostic motioned to get another bid for the lift station pump. Marty Anderson seconded the motion. The motion was approved with all ayes.

6. WASTEWATER FACILITY UPGRADES


Council reviewed emails and information sent by City Engineer, Tom Moore. In order to meet new DEQ standards another pond is needed but no space is available. Land ap could be used but the city would need to buy more land. Current system will not be able to meet ammonia standards by 2026. Mayor Brown and Tom will meet with DEQ compliance officer next month to work on a compliance agreement.



REPORTS:

2. **Pool & Cemetery – Darrell Bostic** – Pool lift chair was put away for winter. Tom Andres came out and showed Jerry how to winterize the pool properly. Darrell asked if the shop could order spare supplies from Ferguson. Also noted city vehicles are dirty and need to be cleaned inside and out and a reminder there is no smoking in vehicles.
3. **Water & Sewer – Dave Cada** – Ski areas still have lots of snow, more than normal for this time of year. The aquafer benefits from the snow melt and the rain. Dave would like the city to put together a Fire Mitigation Plan, specific to Potlatch. He would like to see the clearing of brush and other wildfire hazards. He would like to involve the community in this.
4. **Streets – Marty Anderson** – 10th Street at Larch there is a driveway/alley on the east side that needs gravel. Cars are bottoming out due to the sidewalk. The alley between Fir and Pine needs gravel as well.
5. **Scenic 6 – David Cada** – No report
6. **Mayor – David Brown** – Maintenance is going to Lewiston to get a pellet stove for heating and lumber for a deck and stairs for the back exit at 630 Larch. They can get needed shop supplies on that trip or they can contact Ferguson.
7. **Maintenance – Jerry Ely** – Maintenance needs PPE, will get a list to clerk. Jerry will be working on repairing the backhoe. The reservoir roof panels have become dislodged during a recent wind storm. Jerry has secured the panels around the edge however the wood underneath is rotting. Mayor Brown said we will need to contact a structural engineer and find grant money to put in a new roof.
8. **Clerk – Harmony Nowack** – Thursday Harmony will attend the County's Hazard Mitigation Workshop in Moscow. This is required for the City to be eligible for FEMA funding. Harmony is also working with Tom Moore on a Letter of Interest for a DEQ construction loan for WW improvements and with Mayor Brown on a grant for the RV park.





2. CURT MCLAM – MOU, WILL-SERVE, ELK RIVER ESTATE DEVELOPMENT

Curt has drawn up an MOU due to the slow action of the city's wastewater and drinking water facility plans which keep getting extended. Mayor Brown spoke with the City's attorney who advised not to enter into the agreement as it ties up the limited City resources prematurely. Though Curt said he believes in Potlatch and wants to build here he stated that they cannot wait forever to start development and that he would look into de-annexing if the City can't commit to providing services. Marty would like to have the City Attorney



write up a new agreement that all parties can agree on. Curt agreed to this he just wants a way to move forward, soon.

3. RV PARK IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

The City is currently working on a grant to improve the Scenic 6 RV Park. The improvement under consideration are to move the Camp Host spot and place a 14x30' building by it that can serve as a reception area and store, enclose the dump station, convert the old office/reception building into a laundromat, replace the slab at space #1, replace all picnic tables and add fire rings for the cabins. The City would like to have a 15% match of cash and in kind work.

Council reviewed the quote for cleaning the boilers oil tanks at City Hall. Marty thinks it would be cheaper to buy new tanks and replace the old ones rather than cleaning and would like the city to look into that.



5. COUNTY HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN – DISCUSSION ON CITY MITIGATION ACTIONS

The City of Potlatch is required to participate in the Latah Count Hazard Mitigation Plan. The City is responsible to have action items specific to the City listed in the plan in order to be eligible for funding from FEMA in the case of an adverse event. Council would like new action items to include the roof at the reservoir, portable generators for use at the Senior Center or other building that might be used as a shelter and a back up generator for the Ridge Well.

6. PLANNING AND ZONING COMMITTEE – RECRUTING NEW MEMEBERS

The City has recently lost another member of the Planning and Zoning Committee. There are currently three members and city code states there needs to be five. Dave Cada asked if we needed a separate committee for P&Z or if it could be streamlined by having City Council take it over. Mayor Brown stated that our current P&Z members know more and



it would be a shame to lose them. Dave Cada made a motion to combine Planning and Zoning with City Council, there was no second. Marty suggested putting an ad in the CIA to recruit new P&Z members and have a meeting to meet possible candidates.







2. KME QUOTE – ELECTRICAL – LIFT STATION

Council reviewed two quotes from KME for a surge protector and a soft starter for the lift station. Jerry explained that the lift station surge protector is a three-part system, two parts have not been working. If we have a big surge of power and the system goes out it could be very costly to fix. The soft started is for the pump at the lift station. Currently they are manually turning on the pump then it shuts off on its own. It needs constant monitoring;



the soft starter should kick in and run on it's own without it having to be manually turned back on.

Jennifer Anderson motioned for the City to purchase the surge protector and soft starter for the lift station. Darrell Bostic seconded the motion and the motion was approved with all ayes.

3. BALLFIELD SCOREBOARD/NAME

The scoreboard at the ballfield doesn't work properly and you can no longer get parts. The Potlatch Recreation District and the Booster Club are meeting soon to discuss purchasing a new scoreboard. Mayor Brown would like the fields to be named after the Potlatch Recreation District. The Recreation District has done a lot for this area and have funded many of the amenities in the park as well. Council liked the idea to name the fields after the Recreation District. Mayor Brown will bring this to the next Recreation District meeting.


4. AREA OF IMPACT – DISCUSSION

The Idaho Code regarding areas of city impact are was modified by the legislature last session and went into effect July 2024. It is required that each area of city impact agreement be re-evaluated for compliance with the new criteria and re-adopted prior to the end of 2025. The main changes are the size of the area of impact (areas on impact shall not exceed the areas that are very likely to be annexed to the city within the next 5 years) and the notice from the County on hearings going from 15 days to 30 days. Council reviewed the updated map of Potlatch's area of impact, there were no concerns or requests for changes.





3. RV-PARK – IMPROVEMENTS WITHOUT GRANT FUNDING?

Mayor Brown reported to council that he is unsure if we will get the grant the City has applied for for improvements at the Scenic 6 RV Park. He asked Council for approval to go ahead and make some of the improvements if we do not get grant funding. The City would have to cut back on what the original project entailed. 4. OIL TANK – CITY HALL FURNACE - REVISITED


Oil tanks for the furnace at City Hall need to be cleaned or replaced. A recent quote for cleaning the tanks was \$5690.16. Council requested the price of new tanks, which range from \$1100-\$1300. The City got a rough estimate from St. Joe Oil to replace both tanks, they thought they could do the work for under \$2000. Council requested a quote from St Joe for replacement of tanks and separate quote for moving the tanks outside of the building.

5. PHILANTHROPY NORTHWEST GRANT FUNDING – CITY SPONSER FOR REGIONAL WW PLANNING

Philanthropy Northwest offers a Thriving Communities Planning Grant that could work for the regional WW project. Planning grant awards are up to \$250,000.00. Mayor Brown spoke with the Boise program officer and he was very encouraging that we should apply. Like the GEM Grant the City of Potlatch would need to sponsor the grant (write and administer) on behalf of all the communities involved in the project. Mayor Brown will set up a meeting in March with the Regional Stakeholders to discuss further.

Public Comment:

Clayton Rounds said he has lived in Bennett's Addition for over 30 years, he has experienced flooding here five times and has dug a ditch around his property with a 20" culvert but his place flooded anyway with the recent rain/snow melt off. He thinks the culvert under Onaway Road is too small at 18". Water is coming from Onaway and the farm field next to Bennett's Addition.

Larry Chambers, also from Bennett's Addition stated the water goes across the street and floods out the folks across the street from him. The rain and melt off water was like a river he



was pumping 60-80g/min and could not keep up with the flow and also experienced flooding. He agrees that the culvert at Onaway Road is not big enough to handle water flow like this and thinks the culvert needs to be 3'-4'.

The residents from Bennett's Addition would like the Council, Mayor and City Engineer to come out and look at the culvert and the drainage issue and see if there is something the city can do to keep flooding from happening in the future.


5. CITY HALL OIL TANK CLEANING

2. DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT

Council reviewed the preliminary draft development agreement for Elk River Enterprise development, “Riverview Addition” off HWY 6. The developer will start with a twenty-five (25) foot road with a sixty (60) foot right of way for Phase 1 (four (4) lots). Phase 2



will consist of additional housing in lot five (5). When Phase 2 starts the road will be widened and made to city standards. The development will have city sewer services, each lot will have individual pumps then gravity flow into the city system. Each lot will have its own well, unless the city is able to provide water. Council agreed to let city attorney make these changes to the agreement and council will review again.

Issue tabled until updated agreement updated by attorney.

3. WATER HOOKUPS IN TOWN

There are six (6) open lots in town, three (3) are currently pending sale and three (3) are to be put up for sale. When these lots were divided in 2021 lot owners were told they could have water hookups. With current capacity information, and the city not giving water hookups to the new development, owners of these properties are requesting clarification on whether or not they have water hookups available. City has already told the property owner of the three (3) pending lots that they have hookups. Amber Weber attended council tonight for a guarantee that she can sell her three (3) lots with water hookups.

Darrell Bostic motioned to allow water hookups for three (3) lots owned by the Webers. Marty Anderson seconded the motion. The motion was approved with all ayes.


4. AUTHORIZE CREDIT CARD FOR PAUL KILBORN

Council discussed authorizing a credit card for Paul Kilborn, lead maintenance, as relying on one card shared between City Clerk-Treasurer and maintenance has been cumbersome. Clerk-Treasurer, Harmony Nowack, spoke with Latah Credit Union regarding the process to add Paul as a credit card holder. Paul and Harmony would share the \$20,000.00 limit. Latah Credit Union needs an official agreement and vote from the City Council in order to issue credit cards to city employees.

Jennifer Anderson made a motion to authorize a credit card for Paul Kilborn from Latah Credit Union, Darrell Bostic seconded the motion. The motion was approved with all ayes.

5. LONG-TERM RV PARKING

There have been many complaints about the state of the Long-Term RV parking spots. Tenants are collecting furniture and other debris around their trailers. This is not acceptable



under the lease agreement. Council requested copies of lease agreements and rules for them to look over and update. Council will consider eviction notices if lease agreements are violated.

Jennifer Anderson made a motion to evaluate and upgrade the Long-Term RV Park rules and lease agreement and for City Clerk-Treasurer to send a letter requesting tenet clean up, Marty Anderson seconded the motion. The motion was approved with all ayes.

6. SPLASH PAD HOURS

As the city is working on conserving water, a meter was placed on the Splash Pad to measure how much water is being used during a cycle. In a five (5) minute cycle, five hundred (500) gallons of water is used. It was discussed that hours or days need to be reduced to help with the city's conservation efforts.

Marty Anderson made a motion to cut the Splash Pad hours to 2pm-7pm daily, Jennifer Anderson seconded the motion. The motion was approved with all ayes.

7. WELL DRILLING

Mayor and Council discussed drilling for a new well, where to drill and how close to current infrastructure. The city can not move forward on drilling a well until the facility study is completed, hopefully by the end of August.

Issue tabled until study completion.


8. MOU WITH ONAWAY WATER & SEWER ASSOCIATION

Issue tabled until the city can meet with the Onaway Water & Sewer Association.


REPORTS:

Rates will need to be raised across the board. Looking into putting cameras up at city buildings and in the park. Recent theft of the brass whistle off the train at Scenic 6 Park is sadly making it a reality that we need more surveillance to protect the city's assets and keep our citizens safe. Jason Hill with the railroad and the Historical Society have offered to help clean up the train items in the Scenic 6 Park.

8. **Clerk – Harmony Nowack** – Harmony will work on getting quotes for the cameras and Wi-Fi access to the back portion of Scenic 6 Park. The city's yearly audit started last week and will continue this week, so far everything is looking good.





Martin Anderson made a motion to accept draft agreement with changes, Jennifer Anderson seconded the motion. The motion was approved with all ayes.


5. LONG-TERM RV PARK RULES/LEASE AGREEMENT UPDATES


7. STAFF TO ATTEND IRWA FALL CONFERENCE - MOSCOW




5. REQUEST FOR ROAD ACCESS NEAR RESERVIOR – LOT FOR SALE






5. BUDGET DISCUSSION AND TENATIVE BUDGET APPROVAL







2. DIANE & MICHAEL RILEY- FENCE AT RIDGE WELL

The city recently installed a chain link fence with three lines of barbed wire at the top around the Ridge Well located off Fiddler's Ridge Rd in Potlatch. The fence was installed as part of the DEQ Source Water Protection Grant. These grant funds also helped to pave a parking area at the well and for the city to installed a culvert along the road. Diane and Michael feel that the fence devalues their property. They are demanding that the city give them \$2000.00 to plant drought resistant plants on their property to block their view of the fence. They understand the importance of keeping the water source secure but stated




that the barbed wire is “unfriendly” and they would like to at least see that removed. Another neighbor, Theresa Greiner, attended the meeting with a letter for the council stating she had spoken with DEQ and though fencing was recommended she was told the barbed wire was not necessary but since it was in the grant it must remain until the grant is closed out then the city can make a decision whether to keep it or not. She also believes this fence has devalued her property next door. Neighbor, Terry Carlson, also in attendance mentioned that the gate does not look secure, there is a large gap under the gate and the last rainstorm washed out large gaps on the side of the road near the culvert. Mayor Brown responded to the complaints saying that he and the city council are doing the best they can for the city and are doing all they can to keep all the city facilities secure. He reminded everyone that the city relies heavily on grant funding to do improvement projects such as this one. Marty Anderson responded saying that council would talk to the city engineer about the barbed wire and its necessity before they would make a decision to take it down or not. Mayor Brown stated the city would not purchase plants for the Rileys. He said the city has asked the contractor to place the gate back farther to allow for more space for city trucks/pump truck etc. and the city will address the security of the gate when the contractor returns. City crew will work on the culvert and make sure the road is safe before winter.

- 3. SHARON & JEFFREY DURLAK – PARKING/RAILROAD TIES 8TH & CEDAR**
The city received a complaint that there was railroad ties on the Durlak property near the street that were obstructing parking along the road. Sharon stated the first layer of ties were placed there over two years ago. They recently added a second layer to the ties because cars were parking straddling the ties. Seventeen million years ago a lobe of magma blocked out the Columbia River and the water backed up to create a lake. The magma formed basalt and the lake left silty water on top. We are possibly using this water left from this time when the area was hot and humid. Dave still advises that the city look at drilling waster closer to the city center as drilling again at the Ridgewell would be redundant and it would be better to have a new source of water than redundancy. Mayor Brown mention city engineer, Tom Moore, has reached out to a new hydrogeologist to work with the city on locating the best place for a new well.
4. **Streets – Marty Anderson** – Absent
5. **Scenic 6 – David Cada** – No report.
6. **Mayor – David Brown** – The walking path at Scenic 6 Park was repaired and cracks filled. It looks really good now.
7. **Maintenance – Paul Kilborn** – Paul would like new lights for the train and city float. Mayor Brown said there are plenty of lights, take what you need.
8. **Clerk-Treasurer – Harmony Nowack** – Alerted Council to some new address changes on North Ponderosa Drive. Harmony has been working with the County and the new 911-rollout. The addresses on North Ponderosa Drive were not sequential and new lots had been sold needing to be addressed. Three residences will have their addresses changed in order to



accommodate the new lots and make sense for emergency services. Emergency services will be notified that part of North Ponderosa Dr has been vacated and will be routed accordingly.

Public Comment: Karen Rohn wanted to let the city know that they are working on a project to fix the drainage issue under the train depot. Palouse Valley Septic has been hired to dig drain lines going south from the depot that will possibly cross city and Bennett railroad lands. The Historical Society and WI&MPG are also working to bring Return to Riverside to the depot for next years summer concert. They want the focus to be on the depot. The blue train car will be used as a stage and the parking lot will be the space for the audience. Karen was hoping the city would still bring the bleachers and help keep the parking lot clear leading up to the event. More information to come as they continue planning the event.






4. 2026 COUNCIL MEETING DATES


8. RV STREET PARKING AND HABITATION






4. RENEW CITY HALL LEASES
