- 1. Parks Jennifer Anderson No report
- 2. **Pool & Cemetery Darrell Bostic** Pool has been painted by a volunteer group from the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, and looks very nice. Paul mentioned that Roach construction will be out in this next week and they will be checking the pipes under the pool.
- 3. Water & Sewer Dave Cada Reservoir is holding. The predicted precipitation looks as though we will have a normal winter. Chemtrails are clearing from the sky. Dave has noticed less than the year before and says the future looks good for normal weather patterns.
- 4. **Streets Marty Anderson** Marty and Mayor Brown met with the County Highway District met to look at the culvert on Onaway Rd. The culvert is not repairable. Marty thinks they should move up the road further and put in a 100ft culvert. Steve Normington gave a quote of \$2000.00 to do this work. The County Highway Dist. would cut the pavement. Mayor Brown still feels this is not a city problem as the water is coming from private property. Marty feels it is a city problem when it floods city residences. If a new culvert is installed it would be placed on city right-of-way.

Mayor Brown was advised that we can post a 3 day tow notices on cars that are not observing city code. If the cars are still there in 3 days call the sheriff, they will cite or tow the vehicles.
