Game Bird Foundation gears up for spring events and programs

The Game Bird Foundation will once again partner with Little Canyon Shooting Preserve in Peck, Idaho to offer a free kid's hunting and field day on April 11, 2020.

Kids can participate in guided pheasant hunts behind trained bird dogs, clay shooting, small bore rifle range, and archery range at this all-day free event. The event is open to all kids aged 17 and under who have a valid hunter's education certificate. Lunch is provided and kids must be accompanied by an adult.


Also in April, The Game Bird Foundation will be hosting a field day in Troy, ID, for anyone interested in raising pheasant chicks in 2020. At this informational event, the "pheasant guy", Jim Hagedorn will teach participants everything they need to know to successfully brood, grow and release pheasants as part of the Game Bird Foundation's landmark program.

Raising and releasing pheasants successfully is one of the great ways volunteers can help improve the population of game birds here in the inland empire. It is a fun, educational project for kids and adults alike, teaching about animal husbandry, conservation, responsibility for wildlife, and the rewarding results of seeing newly established populations of game birds.

Since its formation, the Game Bird Foundation has helped numerous individuals successfully raise and release thousands of pheasants each year by providing assistance in the form of instruction, brooders, feed, netting, and additional resources. This assistance is made possible with support from Idaho Fish and Game, Little Canyon Shooting Preserve, and private donations.

As the popularity of these unique programs increases, there is greater and greater need for public support. A one-year membership in the Game Bird Foundation is only \$20.00 and it ensures direct access to all of the outstanding programs the group offers. 

OUR SCHOOLS—February/March 2020

As I mentioned in last month's CIA, we are just around the corner from our annual election day for our school district's Supplemental Levy. The election date is Tuesday, March 10, so please mark that on your calendar and take the time to vote. The District has mailed a short, informational flyer out to all of our registered voters, giving information about 1) This year's levy amount of \$1,750,000, 2) Voting sites, 3) Dates and times for community meetings on the levy, and 4) Voter registration information. Each year we provide an opportunity for community feedback on the upcoming levy and to be part of a conversation with the School Board and District Administration. The dates and times for our Community "Town Hall" Meetings these upcoming weeks are Thursday, February 27 at 7:00 p.m. and Monday, March 2, at 7:00 p.m. Both meetings will be held in the Library at the Junior-Senior High School. We would enjoy seeing you there.

In other news, the Idaho State Department of Education is in the process of gathering input and information from teachers, students, and most importantly, parents throughout the state this upcoming month. The State is asking for parents to take an on-line survey that is part of our statewide accountability system. The survey looks at parent satisfaction of the school district. This includes thoughts on student safety, school leadership, and school communications. Parents interested in taking the survey can go onto our school website and click on the link that we have provided. This takes you to the Idaho State Department of Education website where the survey is available **or** a parent can go directly to the State's website using this link: <https://eprovesurveys.advanc-ed.org/surveys/#action127100p31580>.

The survey should take approximately 10 minutes to complete and it is completely anonymous. All parents are encouraged to participate in the survey. The deadline to take the survey will be March 31, 2020. And lastly, if you didn't know already, beginning this April, the federal government (specifically the U.S. Census Bureau) will be taking their 10-year census. They are making a strong push to have school district's become more involved in the census, in order to ensure a more accurate and complete count. Why schools and/or school districts? Because school districts have an economical "stake" in an accurate account. Census data directly affects monies targeted for support programs, such as Title I, Special Education, National Food Service programming, and Early Childhood. The more accurate and complete the data gathered in our area and district is, the more state and federal dollars will be allocated to meet the needs of the students in our District. This is a "win – win" for everyone. Our students and schools could receive a financial boost to help offset costs for much needed support services and for our community. It could mean a reduction in taxpayer reliance and the lowering of supplemental levies in the future. Here's hoping!
