NEW BUSINESS:

1. SWEAR IN NEW COUNCIL MEMBERS

Harmony Nowack, Clerk-Treasurer, read the Oath of Office for Marty Anderson and Jody Long. Marty and Jody were sworn in to City Council.

Jody Long, yes

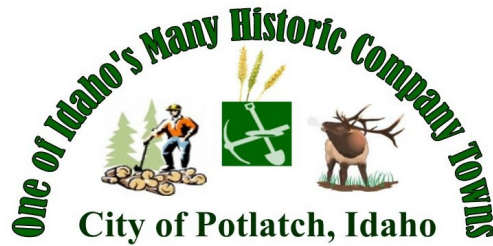

4. FAIR HOUSING RESOLUTION NO. 1-12-26

Mayor Brown read the Fair Housing Resolution No. 1-12-26

5. STUMP REMOVAL

Mayor Brown asked council about removing the stumps from the park next to the Log Cabin and a couple stumps in Scenic Six Park. He could not find the quote he received from a local stump remover but said it was approximately \$1700.00 - a much better deal than the last stump grinding the city had done.

Marty Anderson motioned have the stumps ground in the park by the Log Cabin and in Scenic 6 park. Darrell Bostic seconded the motion. The motion was approved with all ayes.

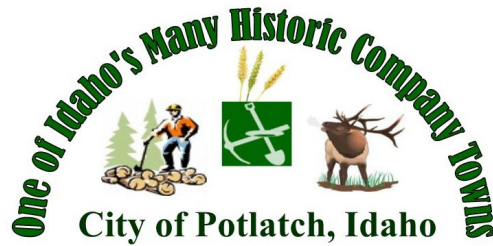
6. RENEW LIQUOR LICENSES

Council review the liquor licenses for Four Star Supply, Harvest Foods, Red Fir Coffee House, and Codi Jo's Wagon Wheel.

Marty Anderson motioned to renew liquor licenses for Four Star Supply, Harvest Foods, Red Fir Coffee House, and Codi Jo's Wagon Wheel. Jennifer Anderson seconded the motion and the motion passed with all ayes.

- 2. Pool & Cemetery – Darrell Bostic** – Darrell asked when the pool repair would start. Mayor Brown said the city would be putting out RFP soon. The timeline is set to have the work done before the pool opens, ideally by mid-May.

5. **Mayor – David Brown** – Aeon, the supplier for the broadband project hauled in rock and placed it at the back of Scenic 6 Park near the yard waste bin to store the rolls of cables/fiber/conduit. Harmony handed out a Service Agreement for Northwest Groundwater Consultants, LLC (Tom Mullens) for hydrogeologic services. Mayor Brown asked Council to review this, it will be on the next meeting's agenda.
6. **Maintenance – Paul Kilborn** – Paul asked if we own the propane tank at the reservoir that was used for the old generator. Harmony will call Clearwater and see if it belongs to them but Mayor Brown and Marty think it belongs to the city.
7. **Clerk-Treasurer – Harmony Nowack** – The City Hall furnace has been fixed and running great!

Before concluding the meeting Mayor Brown presented Dave Cada with a plaque recognizing his 23+ years of service on the City Council and a proclamation bestowing Dave with the title of Councilman Emeritus and City Historian.
