

We raised and released 240 of these this year. They are doing great so far. We have not had to do any supplemental feed this winter as we want to see how they survive. We hope to have feed and if it comes down to it, we will start feeding them. We want to raise more redlegged partridges next year and we have 2000 eggs ordered now. If we can raise some more money, we would like to get another 1000 eggs. These are one of the easiest birds to raise, we hatched 256 and released 240. The most we lost were those that didn't hatch well and were very weak. We will feed all pheasant populations if needed and if we have the feed.

If you would like to raise some of these and could help out with some of the costs we would sure appreciate it. If you can't raise them, please donate a few \$ to help us along. You can go to The Gamebird Foundation Web and make a donation or you can join and pay membership dues with a credit card. Dues are \$25.00 for a family. 

Gamebird Foundation February 2021 News:

2020 was a busy year for the Gamebird Foundation, since I took over the supplies for the birds, feed, picking up birds, and distributing all of the above. I foresee 2021 to be just as busy, if not more so, since our goal is to raise more birds. I love doing all of this since I had a poultry business in Kodiak, AK, before I moved to Idaho and have raised birds for the last 16 years. I love sharing what I have learned in raising domesticated and wild birds. I also love hearing the success stories of raising pheasants and Red-Legs from the other Foundation members and have shared what works with others.

You, too, can raise pheasants for release in our Region by becoming a Member or renewing your Membership with the Gamebird Foundation. It is just \$25 for a 1-year membership for a family. Go online to our website and join/renew now: <u>www.thegamebirdfoundation.org/</u>.

Pheasants will be available to be raised from May 1st to June 30th. These dates may vary depending on how the hatching goes. I will keep everyone informed. There will be approximately 800-1200 birds available for distribution each week. You will need to contact me ASAP to let me know which week you want to receive Pheasant chicks and how many you would like to raise at one time. Please send me an email with all of your contact information, the number of chicks to raise, and your 1st, 2nd and 3rd choice weeks to receive them. I will accommodate your requested dates and amounts the best I can. Red-Legged Partridge dates will be determined once the eggs go in the incubator. It will most likely be after the last hatch date for the pheasants.

Please contact me with your questions about raising Pheasants, to pick up brooders, soft release/flight pens, and any other supplies needed to raise the pheasants. If I don't answer the phone, please leave a message or send me an email and I will get back to you as soon as I can. I look forward to another productive year of raising Pheasants and Red-Legged Partridges with the Game Bird Foundation.

Licensed & Insured in Idaho & Washington With the return to a more traditional model of delivery, the district will be losing one of the strengths that came from our "Hybrid" model of delivery, that being the ability to social distance properly. In losing this opportunity, the school district will be requiring students and staff to wear masks and/or face shields <u>inside</u> of our buildings. This will not be an option or a recommendation, this will be a <u>requirement</u>. Also, with the introduction and rollout of the COVID-19 vaccine within our state and nation, our staff have the opportunity to receive further protection, if they so choose, by receiving vaccination shots. Currently, we have nearly 60% of our staff interested in being vaccinated. Once the vaccination process has been completed and local/county COVID-19 levels are meeting re-entry plan requirements, school will move from the "Hybrid, A-B" delivery model to an "All-day, Every day" model. We are cautious and making sure that we do everything possible to keep students and staff safe and healthy. At the same time, we are extremely excited to take this step forward to provide the opportunity for students to receive a more complete education, to be able to socialize and play with their peers, and most importantly, be full-time students again.

The Board of Trustees and Administration set our Supplemental Levy amount for the upcoming school year of 2021-2022. For the past three (3) years we have stayed steady at \$1,750,000, no increases over that time. I am pleased to say that this year we will be able to **lower** the levy amount, from \$1,750,000 to \$1,650,000. This is a significant decrease and will allow some tax relief to our taxpayers at a time where every little bit of financial savings can help. **The Levy vote will take place on Tuesday, March 9th**. I will provide more information and details on our Supplemental Levy in next month's CIA, as well as on our District's website so stay tuned.



What is the Potlatch Recreation District?

The Potlatch Recreation District was created in 2001 through efforts of local community members and appointment by the governor. Idaho Recreation Districts are organized for the uses and purposes of acquiring, providing, maintaining, and operating public recreation areas and facilities for the use of the public. Potlatch Recreation District serves the Harvard, Princeton, and Potlatch areas. The district is administered by 3 publicly elected directors residing in 3 sub districts and is funded through tax dollars.

Many of our projects are quite visible in our communities. The park in Princeton was purchased, built and is maintained by the Rec. District. The Scenic Six Park lighting, swimming pool repairs, horseshoe pits, flags, and baseball/softball fields and their lawn care are provided by the Recreation District. Our projects last year included the new backstops at the upper field at the elementary school, a portion of funding for the PTO's new playground equipment on both sides of the elementary school, a supply shed for the Onaway Park, youth baseball funding, pickleball court, bleachers and the Potlatch pool. As we need to maintain our projects, this year we would like to save for improvements to the Scenic Six ball fields.

Grants for project funding can be applied for by anyone! We encourage recommendations for projects, which will be taken into consideration at monthly public meetings.

Pheasants will be available to be raised from May 1st to June 30th. These dates may vary depending on how the hatching goes. There will be approximately 800-1200 birds available for distribution each week. Please send her an email as soon as possible with all of your contact information, the number of chicks to raise, and your 1st, 2nd, and 3rd choice weeks to receive them. Chris will accommodate your requested dates and amounts the best she can. Red-Legged Partridge dates will be determined once the eggs go in the incubator. Chris is also in charge of answering any pheasant raising questions and our equipment/supplies to raise them. Please call her to pick up brooders, soft release/flight pens, and any other supplies needed to raise the pheasants. If she doesn't answer the phone, please leave a message or send her an email and I will get back to you as soon as I can. I look forward to another productive year of raising Pheasants and Red Legged Partridges with the Game Bird Foundation.

OUR SCHOOLS: February/March 2021

There is a lot to share this past month, as well as for the start of March. The biggest news is that we will be moving from our current model of school, which is/was a "Hybrid – A/B" model, where our students were attending school two (2) days a week and working from home the remaining three (3) with online supports from their teachers. This will all change on Monday, February 22. We will be returning to a more traditional model and our students will return to school full-time, five (5) days a week, and all-day, every day. This will be in place for the remainder of the school year unless a reoccurrence of the pandemic comes back or something of that nature would force us to change back to a hybrid model or virtual model of educational delivery. Here's hoping and fingers crossed!

It's Levy time again. We will be running our annual Supplemental Levy on Tuesday, March 9. For the past three (3) years we have been steady, running the levy for \$1,750,000 each of those years. This year, the levy has been lowered by \$100,000. It will now be run for \$1,650.000. This will provide a savings to our taxpayers, and in a time where we all have been hit hard due to the pandemic, every amount of relief and savings is needed and appreciated.

We will be sending flyers out to all taxpayers and homeowners in the next few weeks, sharing exact information on district needs, tax rates, and estimated changes and costs. We will also be providing a "town hall" meeting for all interested stakeholders. Supplemental levy information will be shared by the Board of Trustees at that time and discussion time will be given for the community to ask questions. This will be held on Tuesday, March 2, at 7:00 p.m., and will be held at the Jr.-Sr. High School Gymnasium. We will be spread out throughout the Gym in order to maintain social distancing whenever possible. Masks and/or face shields will be required to be worn inside our facility. If you would like to listen to the discussion, we will also be placing the meeting on Zoom, so those who cannot attend will still have the opportunity to listen in.

Two staff members have turned in their resignations and will be leaving us shortly. Lisa Bunney, almost ten (10) years as our Elementary Custodian, will be leaving us at the end of February for a new job opportunity. Lisa has been an outstanding worker and a valuable member of the Elementary staff. She will be tremendously missed. We wish her the very best in all her future endeavors. The retirement "bells" are starting to ring for Mr. John Haire, our Elementary School Principal. John has worked for our District for thirty (30) years! The first nineteen (19) of which were as an elementary teacher and the last eleven (11) years have been spent as the Elementary Principal. John will finish out the remainder of this school year and then bid us all "adieu" this coming June after a great and outstanding career as an educator and leader. He too will be sorely missed.



The Leaseburg home is already under construction and is expected to be complete later this summer. The build was delayed due to the pandemic. Construction was limited to one day a week with core group of volunteers. The annual fundraiser was delayed and eventually went online.

Habitat hopes to begin construction on the Hansen home this spring. The home is projected to cost over \$130,000 due to the rising cost of building materials. Selected homeowners must contribute 300-400 hours of "sweat equity", working along-side the volunteers building their homes, contribute a share of the closing costs, participate in a financial education program, and ultimately purchase the home from Palouse Habitat for an affordable mortgage.

Preserve @ Home

Do you want to learn how to safely can, dry or freeze your garden's bounty? University of Idaho Extension invites you to enroll in Preserve@Home, an in-depth, online food preservation class to teach individuals how to safely preserve a variety of foods. Participants learn how to produce highquality, preserved foods and the science behind food preservation and food safety.

The registration deadline is Monday, **June 7**, **2021**. The first lesson of the 6-week course opens online on **Thursday**, **June 10 at 1 pm MT**. 

MOUNTAIN HOME GRANGE # 285 IS COMING BACK!

Twenty-nine people met with representatives of the state and national grange on April 17, to recharter the Mountain Home Grange. Organized by forty members in April 1931, the grange started cutting logs which were hauled to the Alvah Strong mill to be sawed into lumber to build the hall. Land for the hall was donated by Mr. and Mrs. Frank Hanna in 1934, and the first meeting in the new hall was in January 1936.

The voting place was moved to the grange hall from the Burden School in 1936. In May 1939, the grange sponsored the F.M.B.E. 4H Club, and the Juvenile Grange No. 88 was chartered in 1953. That same year the kitchen, juvenile hall, and stage were completed and celebrated by a dinner in the new kitchen for 100 people. Be a part of our history and come help revitalize this important community building! The only other historic building remaining in the NW part of Latah County is the Elmore Church which was built in 1918.



KELLY'S SPLASH PARK DEDICATION

Ever wondered what a Splash Pad is? Well, it's where you go to get wet and cool off. Just stand and let the water soak you down or walk around and get hit by several nozzles! Potlatch's Scenic Six Park has one on the west side of the park. Here's how it came into being.

Robin Woods, our local representative for the Idaho Department of Commerce, told me about a new program that Commerce had started for parks. I asked her if Splash Pads would qualify, she checked, and it did.

Kelly Dahlquist, a grant writer at Clearwater Economic Development Association, was contacted and asked if they would write the grant and she said, "yes". Kelly told me that the City of Orofino had just put one in, so she made arrangements with them for a viewing. Kelly, Joan Bender, Salie Anderson, and I went down for a peek and met with the city manager and the city people that built it. We went on to Kooskia to view another one there.

We bought our fixtures from Raindeck, out of Mesa, Arizona. I went to their website and picked the above ground fixtures, and talked with them about what I wanted. I told them the specifications wanted for the pad, then they designed and engineered the pad and added the ground level jets. They also added 2 footings that we can add fixtures to when we have the money to buy them.

It is a \$120,000 dollar project: we received \$80,000 from commerce, \$10,000 cash from the Potlatch Recreation District, \$10,000 cash from the City and then \$15,000 of In-Kind. The In-Kind consists of Source Electric, the city's labor, and a grant written by Brett Carpenter to the Board of Realtors that paid for the concrete slap and seating benches.

It became a far bigger project than I had anticipated, so I hope everyone will enjoy it and have lots of fun.

The lady, Kelly, that wrote the grant, found out about a month after she wrote and received the grant, that she had terminal cancer. On July 17, 2019, Kelly passed away. So in memory, we have named the splash pad, "Kelly's Splash Park".

We will have a dedication on the 19th of June at 2:00 p.m. with hot dogs and drinks.

The dream was as vivid as real life. I saw a young man sitting on the side of his bed in the middle of the night, hunched over. The permeating feeling was one of utter despair. I could see his war demons clustered around, dragging him down into an emotional gutter. Then, as if viewing a movie, I saw him in the next scene wrapped in a quilt. His whole demeanor changed from one of despair to one of hope and well-being. The quilt had made this dramatic change. The message of my dream was: **Quilts = Healing.**

The model appeared simple: have a volunteer team who would donate their time and materials to make a guilt. One person would piece the top and the other would quilt it. I saw the name for this special quilt. It was a Quilt of Valor, a

Hello to all you Pheasant, Red Legged Partridge and all other bird lovers. **MEETINGS:** The Gamebird Foundation will now be meeting the first Thursday of each month starting December 2. We will be meeting in the Board Room of the Farm Bureau Insurance Office in Moscow at 220 Farm Road. You enter through the parking lot off of A Street behind WinCo. Meetings always start at 6:00 p.m. and all are welcome. Subject to change on occasion, we will notify in advance.

FREE SHOTGUN SHELLS FOR YOUTH: CCI Speer donated some 20-gauge shotgun shells for young hunters. We will have a few FREE boxes of shells to pass out to young hunters who come to our meetings.

PUPPIES: The two young 13-year-old youth that won the 2 English Pointer pups that Dan Blanco donated to help raise money for Red-Legged Partridge eggs are Jonas Reddering from the Moscow-Viola area and Kain Ford from the St. Maries area. We had some wonderful essays and it was a hard decision to make. We have some great kids out there looking for a hunting dog. If you have a dog or pup, you want to donate, please contact me. There are some good homes waiting. Thanks Dan, for your generous donation and for all you do.

PHEASANT RELEASES: It is getting close to the tail end of pheasant release at the Youth Access YES Area. I see pheasants most every time I go over. We talk to some folks that are hunting over there with the kids and they are harvesting some of the best roosters we have seen in years.

RAISING CHICKS NEXT YEAR? In about 4 months, we will be receiving baby pheasant chicks. How many of you folks out there reading this are ready for chicks? Remember you will need a brooder, a soft release pen, and proper feeding and watering facilities. If you do not have a good brooder or a soft release pen, you need to get started NOW! It takes time to get the facilities built. We are not going to wait until the birds start coming to start building. If you are not ready, you won't get any chicks. Last year, we had folks trying to locate and build brooders and soft release pens, and locate feed and the birds were due the next day. This will not work, we must do it right. It is a lot of work just taking care of the orders every week, let alone the supplies to raise them. Remember, we are all volunteers; we need you to help with some of the load. If you want to raise chicks, or just help, give us a call or email and we will give you all the help you need to get set up. Space and chicks are limited. We are a 501C3 Corporation and any donation is a tax write off. We need your help. HABITAT: We now have a seeder to do habitat development. Give us a call if you are interested. 
