OUR SCHOOLS

I want to begin this month's article by congratulating our Logger Boys Basketball team on their 3rd place finish at the State Basketball tournament. I also want to give a shout out to coaches Ryan Ball and Cole Thompson, as well as volunteers Ron Lovell and Devin Richards for their work with our athletes this season. Thanks, to each of YOU for the support you gave our coaches, our athletes, our cheerleaders, and our band members. I know each of you were with them on the court, whether that was in person at Vallivue High School, or at a watch party here in town. Donations from some patrons allowed our team to travel on a charter bus and allowed our cheerleaders and the band to attend and rally the crowd.

Superintendent question of the month: What is the deal with buses that are parked behind the Ag Shop? All buses purchased by the district are placed on a state depreciation schedule for 12 years. The state reimburses the district for an estimated 80% of the cost of a bus over that time. The monies received from the depreciation can only be used to purchase new buses. We do try trading buses in when we purchase a new bus; however, many times the trade in amount is less than what we would receive from the state in depreciation. Those buses parked behind Ag Shop are still getting depreciation money and/or they are used for parts to repair the other buses in our fleet. We do surplus buses when they no longer serve a useful purpose.

At our March Board meeting, a resolution was passed for the district to run a 1.7 million dollar supplemental levy. You will have the opportunity to vote on this levy May 21st. The estimated annual cost of the proposed levy is a tax of \$355.17 per \$100,000 of assessed value, per year, based on current conditions. The proposed levy will be assessed over one (1) year.

What is the purpose of a supplemental levy? It is to make up the difference between what we receive in State and Federal funding and what it costs to keep programs intact. The last few years, the district has tried to lower the amount of our levy because we had ESSER (aka Covid) funding that we used to backfill operating costs such as maintenance of buildings and updating resources. Programs such as Family and Consumer Science, Agriculture/FFA, Business, Music, Art/STEAM, and Extra-Curricular activities are all supported by our supplemental levy. In addition, support staff who assist in special education, small reading groups, recess and lunch supervision, grounds, maintenance, and technology are also funded with our supplemental levy.

What about monies we received from the Idaho Career Ready Students grant? Again, we are very fortunate to have been an early recipient of these funds and were awarded \$989,198. These funds cannot be used for staffing. They are only to be used to update equipment and expand the facility to prepare to add a Natural Resources/Forestry pathway program for our students.

So far, purchases include 5 Synchrowave Miller Welders that will be used primarily for Stick and TIG welding and 5 Millermatic Miller Welders that will be used primarily for MIG welding. In addition, an Ellis bandsaw and drill press have arrived. There are plans to expand the welding booth set up to allow for an increased number of students to weld at once.

Students have been using a new Ironworker that was purchased to cut and bend metal. This piece of equipment will soon be set to start punching holes in metal as well. Students have expressed their excitement at the ease of which the Ironworker cuts metal and are anxious to begin using other new equipment. Potlatch's Ag Instructor, Mrs. Hille, says the new equipment allows students more time to focus on developing their welding skills rather than waiting in line to cut metal.

Potlatch School District is thankful for the many new opportunities available to our students because of these funds. We are thankful for our partners in the Technical Advisory Council, the Potlatch FFA Alumni Association, and the University of Idaho for working with us to make this dream a reality!

We want this program to continue to develop and is another reason our supplemental levy is so critical.

The April Coffee with the Superintendent is scheduled for April 3 at 10:30pm. Ryan Beckner will be joining me at Tamarack Cafe. We would love to visit with you there. I appreciate the conversations we have had since we began these monthly meetings.
