Our Schools

Once again, I want to say "thank you" for your support of the supplemental levy. We live in a great community, and I know you expect great things from our schools. We will continue to work to improve learning opportunities for students, with our goal being that they are successful and contribute to our community. The Class of 2025 has plans to do just that. I was reminded why I am an educator as I heard the plans of our graduates. Some are going straight into the workforce; some are pursuing certifications in welding or getting their CDL; some are going to trade school or college; and some are pursuing mission or humanitarian work abroad before going to college.
